

#### Matching Scholarship Policy:

CVAC Students attending Seventh-day Adventist Schools have the ability to lower their tuition costs through the cooperation of the local church and the educational institution. This cooperation is called a Matching Scholarship. The CVAC is supportive of this effort. Both the student and the Church Board have responsibilities to make these scholarships happen in both a fair and timely manner.

1. The Student or Parent/Guardian should request the current Matching Scholarship information from their school.

2. The Student or Parent/Guardian should make this request known to the Church Board by the October 1<sup>ST</sup>. Current Matching Scholarship information from the school should be sent to the Church Board at this time.

3. In October the Church Board will begin to appeal to the church family, in the bulletin, for needed scholarship funds.

4. Dedicated scholarship monies will be directed to the student's account via a Church check cut by the treasurer.

5. Non-dedicated scholarship monies shall be divided among the applicants at the discretion of the Church Board. Monies may be divided evenly among all the students. Monies may be used for hardship cases. Or some combination. The Church Board will measure the need and try to distribute these funds in the most equitable manner. These monies will be directed to the student's account via a Church check cut by the treasurer.

6. The Church Board will conclude this work by the January board meeting of the school year.
